Today there is no sign, nothing inside this town that most of it were Jewish.

We met the major of the town and the priest. Maybe they will put a sign, plaque, something like that. Today nothing from hundreds of years of life, of full life inside this town and community that was there. And we are still today research about more details about the murder of Josef Kopf. And we are in contact with a family, the Polish family that today it's like our family, talking with them knowing few words in Polish translated by the son when we contact with them.
